**Doctrine in 2 Timothy 1**

2 Timothy 1 is a deeply personal letter from Paul to Timothy, encouraging him to remain **faithful, courageous, and steadfast** in the gospel. Paul emphasizes the **power of God's calling, the necessity of boldness in suffering, and the importance of guarding sound doctrine**.

**1. Encouragement to Remain Faithful (2 Timothy 1:1-7)**
